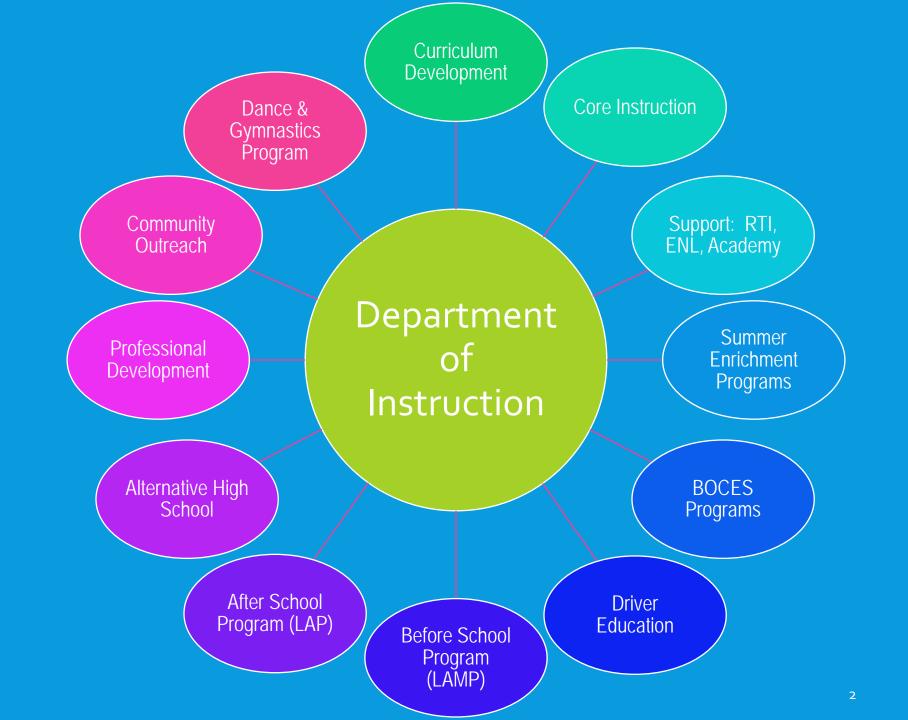

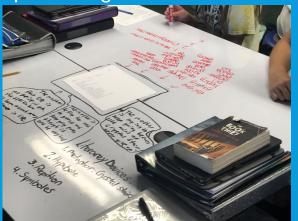
- Addition of new Middle School Robotics summer program

- 4. I understand that our flexible seating options are here to help me learn and should be treated with respect, just like all of our other classroom materials







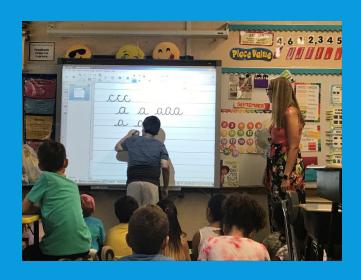
- Implementation of Dimension science program in grades K-3 and 5 as well as teacher designed STEAM units in grades K-5

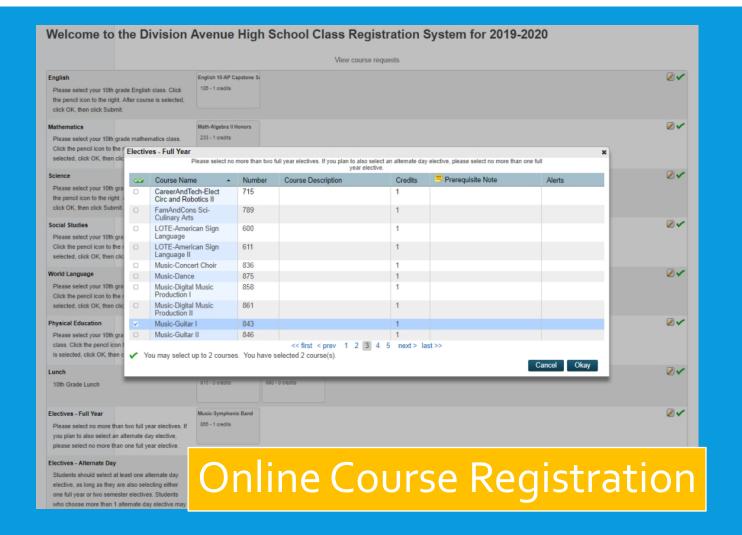

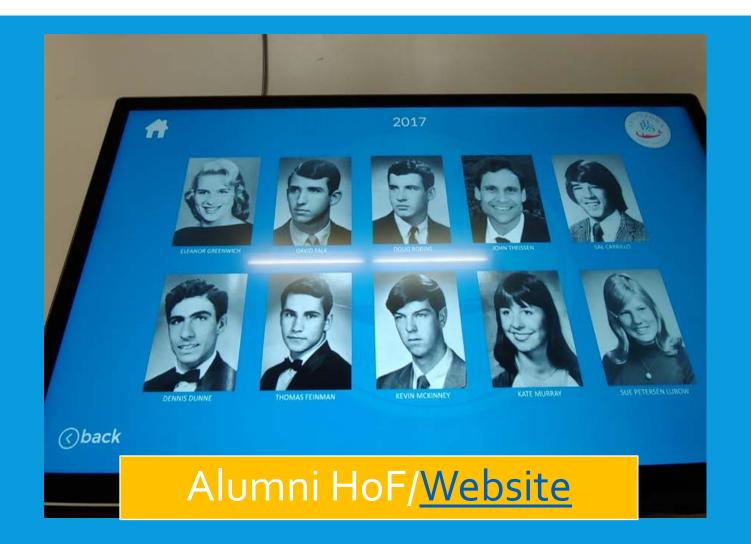


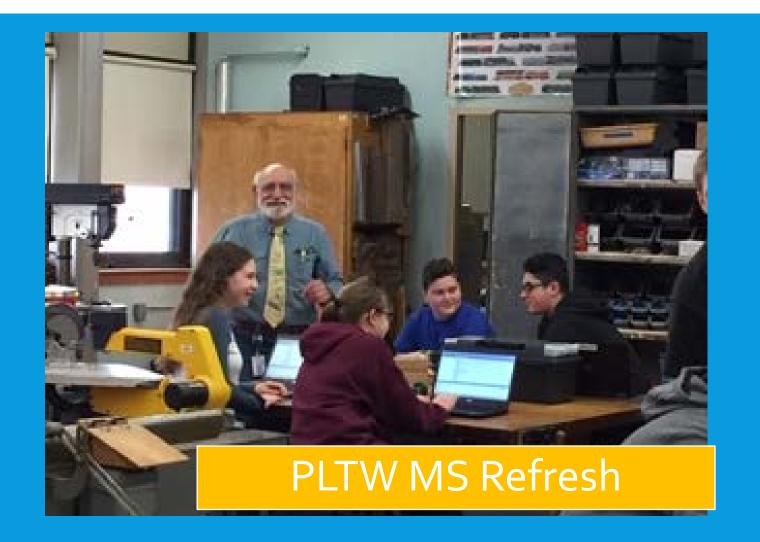

### **Equipment Refresh**

- Desktop PC's average 7 yrs
  - Replace 790's/990's, 7 yrs old
- Laptops average 5-6 yrs
  - Replace oldest models used instructionally, E5430, E6430
- iPads 7 yrs
  - Refreshed ½ last year
  - Hardware limitations
  - iPad 2's in classroom carts
- SmartBoards expect 8-9 yrs
  - Average age 7 yrs old
- Projectors average 5-6 yrs
  - Replaced as needed



# **Equipment Refresh**

- HP network switches expect 10 yrs
  - Avg. 6 ½ yrs old, modular
  - 10 Gb upgrade on backend fiber completed 2 yrs ago
- Cisco Firewall expect 8 years
  - 2 years old
- WiFi Access Points
  - Most 6 yrs old, some newer
  - Beginning upgrade process (controller, key access points)

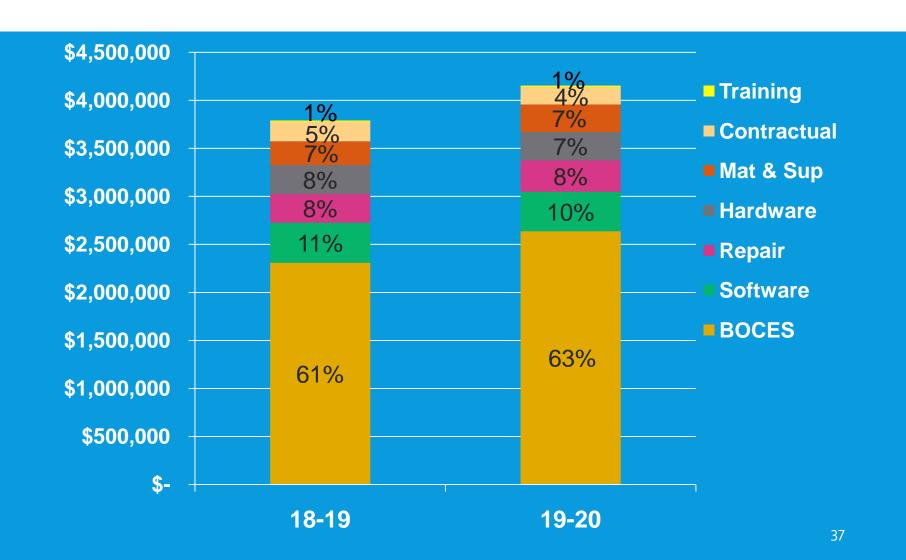
