




Points of Pride 2019-2020




IF INGESTION OR SUSPECTED INGESTION OF ALLERGEN OCCURS, SYMPTOMS ARE FREQUENT AND EXHAUSTIVE IS ORDERED, GIVE EPINEPHRINE IMMEDIATELY AND CALL 911.
 Epinephrine provides a 20 minute response window. After epinephrine, a student may feel dizzy or have an increased heart rate. This is a normal response. Students receiving epinephrine should be transported to the hospital by ambulance. A staff member should accompany the student to the emergency room if the parent, guardian or emergency contact is not present and adequate supervision for other students is provided.



Planned Initiatives 2020-2021

Review efficacy of summer programs in order to ensure robust opportunities are available to students :

Proposal:

- Discontinue the Summer Tutorial and Summer Reading programs as enrollment in those programs has been steadily declining.
- Increase attention on the primary grades by building on the success of the Summer Readiness Pre-K Summer Program. Expand Readiness (Summer Academies) program from just incoming K student to those entering first grade and second grade.
 - Allowable expense using new aid category called *Community Schools*.

Community Schools Aid

Potential uses of new aid category:

- Summer Readiness Pre-K-2 Summer Program.
- Aquaponics Program.
- Social-Emotional Programming & Support (Responsive Classroom).

Budget Drivers 2020-2021

- Journeys Online Access Grades K-5: \$156,000
- Implementation of EnVision 2020 Grades K-5: \$30,000
- Books for new courses: \$70,000
- Expansion of Summer Academies: \$30,000

Department Budget Historical Perspective

2019-2020: \$5,808,573

2020-2021: \$9,699,059*

Year-to-Year Change: \$3,905,486 or 66.98%

*-BOCES tuition for GC Tech is included in these codes, which is an anomaly this year and is mitigated by state aid.

With that information excluded, the increase is:

2019-2020: \$5,808,573

2020-2021: \$6,099,059

Year-to-Year Change: \$ 290,486 or 5%






