DEPARTMENT GOAL



GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: Students in grades 10-12 must take a .5 credit course in financial literacy prior to graduation.





UPDATED GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS 2024-2025



FINANCIAL LITERACY

Students will be required to take a half-credit elective course in financial literacy. The course, Financial Literacy & Readiness, will be open to students in grades 10-12. Beginning with the Class of 2027, all students need to meet this requirement for graduation.

SCHEDULING



Students in grades 9-11 will be scheduled for 9 periods a day. Seniors will be scheduled at a MINIMUM for 5 periods plus physical education beginning in the 2024-2025 school year.




