Guest Speaker: Mr. Gary Hudes - "The Town of Hempstead and Me" The presentation touch on topics available in the town for residents. Building Department: orange signs in window must be on property which grants the proper permits. Street Lighting: single light out is an easy fix. Water Department: located at Lido Beach conservation. Testing and keep water clean. Downtown Revitalization: Town will pay for 1/2 the renovation done by businesses. Curb side Tree Planting Program: senior citizens no cost, \$175 for a curb tree planting. Senior Citizens Program: locations; 555 New Bridge Road, and Seaman's Neck Road activities for seniors.
