### **Standing Committees:**

Cultural Arts: Jan 8th: Eric's Adventures for 1st grade. Feb 13th: David Engel Pirates K-2 and then 3-5.

<u>Council Budget</u>: Northside requested replacements of some windows, asked for 2 basketball hoops outside. We have been given new playground equipment. The gym will get new windows for better ventilation. MacArthur will get a new cafeteria and band uniforms. PTA asked for a grant writer for district.

Elementary Curriculum: Dec 17<sup>th</sup> meeting: new maturation video was presented, viewed both girl and boy videos. They were very relatable and basic for 5<sup>th</sup> graders. State made changes for ELA & Math assessment: decreased time by 10 minutes and number of questions and days. Jan. 21<sup>st</sup> meeting: Changes are being made on the report cards, there have been grading inconsistencies reported when something has yet to be taught in class. Power School has constraints as to what can change mid year, some wording can change and some "x" on 2<sup>nd</sup> trimester report card. Elementary math: every 4 topics have a benchmark assessment used to inform instruction. Students will have 2-3 benchmarks per year in both Math and ELA. Next meeting: Feb. 14<sup>th</sup>

<u>Health, Safety & Environment</u>: Sep. 13<sup>th</sup> meeting: discussed the implementation of security cameras, door buzzers and swipe cards entry system. As hall monitors retire/resign they will be replaced with security aides, with specialized history in law enforcement. Snow day procedures: possibilities of early dismissal, bus delays and ways to convey to parents delays in bus arrival. Ice patch produced by drain pipe near 4<sup>th</sup> grade door and muddy field were addressed. The issue was raised for an informational session being available for 5<sup>th</sup> grade dances. Chair presented PTA making home drug tests available for parents of older students. This was the first meeting elementary schools were asked to attend, and asked for a representative at future meetings.

Family Fun: Snowball was on January 24<sup>th</sup>

<u>Food Service</u>: Food changes: going all whole grain starting September 2014, and chips will be low sodium. Money issues: students are not given change when paying with cash, it was being applied to their accounts. This problem has be addressed and taken care of in November. Division Ave. High School cafeteria wasn't completed on time, there are issues with broken cabinets, floor, improper placement of sinks, countertops and oven. MacArthur is in the beginning stages of bids on cafeteria construction.
