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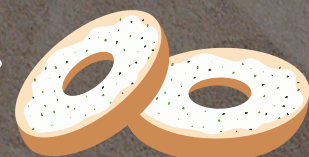

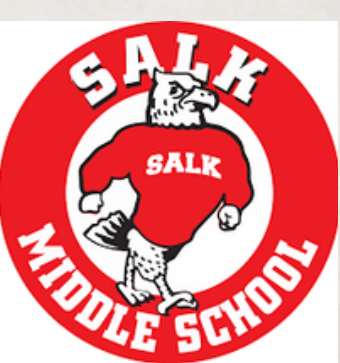

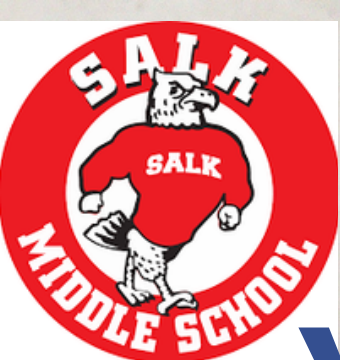


RESPECTING EACH OTHER

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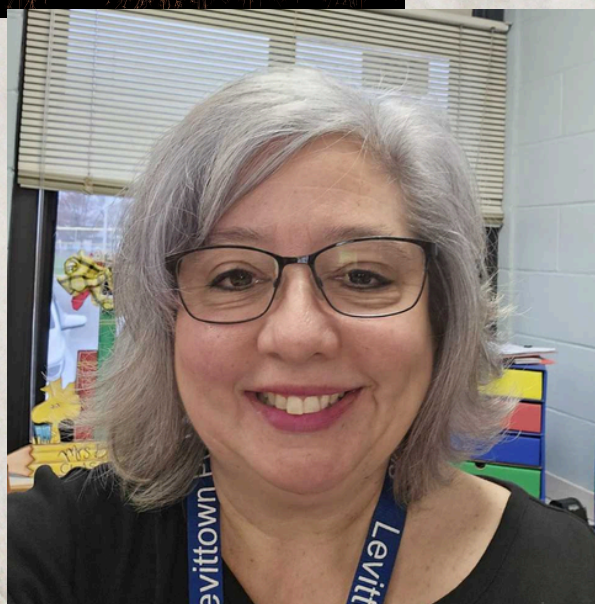

If you weren't a teacher, what would you want to be?

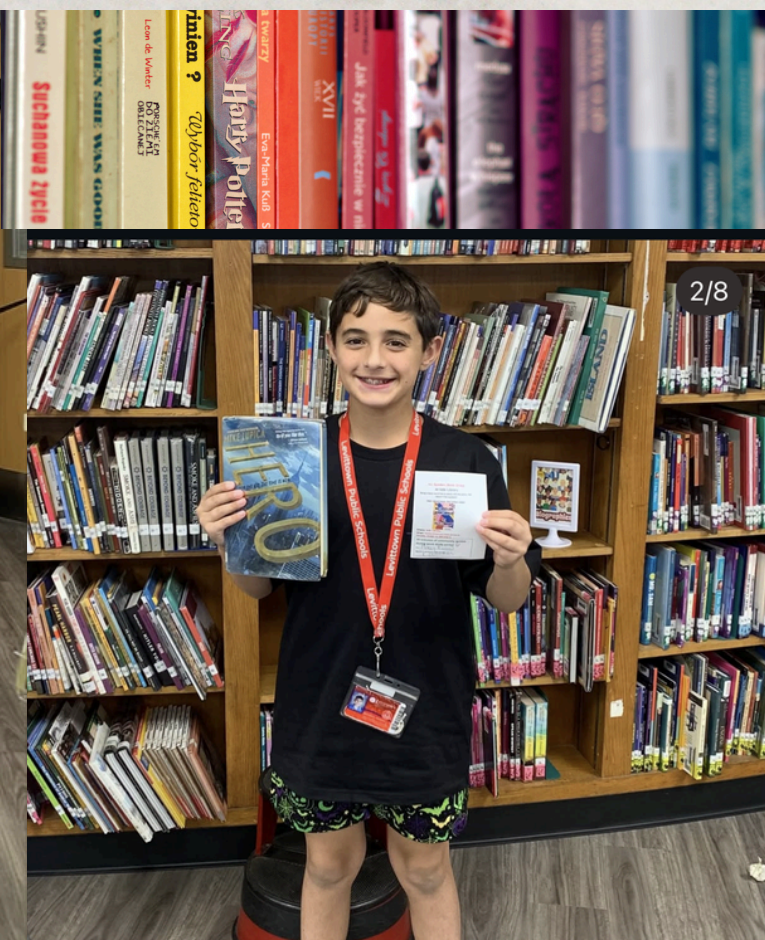
I am not sure! I think if the Food Network had existed when I was a kid, I would have done something in the restaurant field. Maybe I would have owned a restaurant by now!



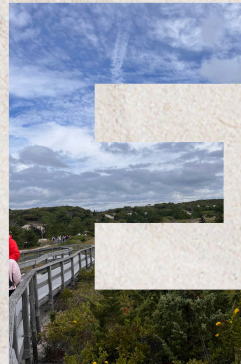

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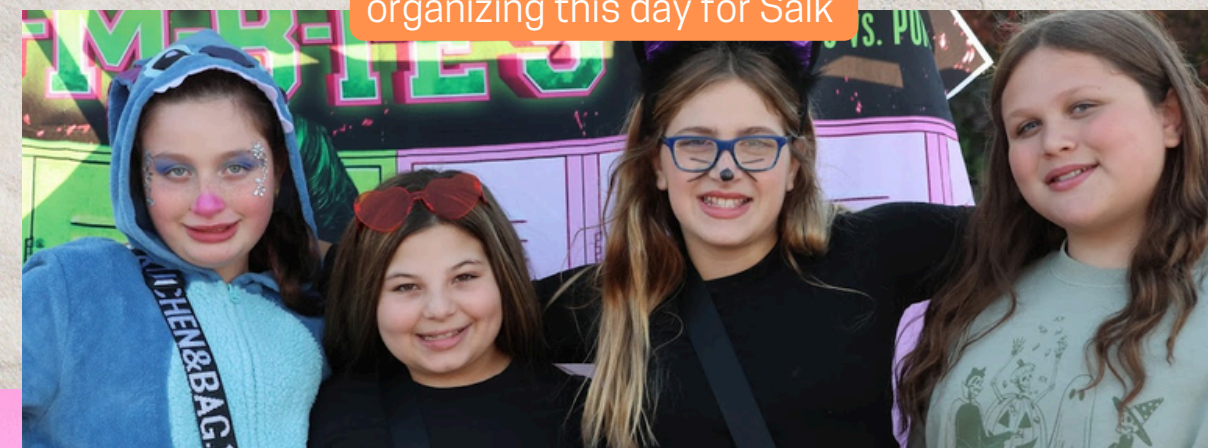
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Salk Trunk-Or-Treat
