A Message from the OF EDUCATION...

Proposed 2017-18 Budget Remains Within the Tax Cap

Through careful and resourceful planning and a collaborative effort with Central Administration, the Board of Education has proposed a 2017-18 budget totaling \$210,218,722 that keeps rising costs minimal while preserving the district's key instructional and co-curricular programs.

In preparing for the 2017-18 budget, the Board elected to adopt a tax levy increase of 1.14 percent, which is the allowable tax levy cap as per state law and which realizes a budget-to-budget increase of 2.32 percent. This proposed spending plan maintains and enhances the one-to-one tablet initiative, introduction of AP Capstone Research, the addition and revision of high school courses, expansion of technology initiatives and the STEAM program, the offering of a summer science camp (Camp Invention) and expansion of the World Language program. The spending plan also supports the purchase of four buses and three vans to replace an aging fleet, as well as bus cameras and updated GPS systems for the district's bus fleet.

Student achievement continues to bring great pride to the Levittown community. This newsletter highlights many of our students' educational and co-curricular achievements and contains the special spring edition of the Levittown Leader, spotlighting the district's Outdoor Learning Center program. We encourage residents to become familiar with highlights of the proposed budget, establishment of the 2017 Capital Reserve Fund and expenditure of funds from the 2013 Capital Reserve Fund (below) for the purpose of improving district facilities. Information on voting qualifications, absentee ballots and the budget hearing is also included. We also invite the community to review the budget presentations posted on the district website.

Repairs and Renovations of Facilities **Using Capital Reserves**

In addition to the district's proposed budget, the community will be asked to vote on two additional propositions.

Proposition 2 would establish a 2017 Capital Reserve Fund totaling \$25 million for the purpose of financing districtwide repairs, renovations and improvements over a ten-year period. Funding for the Capital Reserve Fund would be sourced from budget appropriations, unappropriated fund balances made available by the Board of Education, and authorized transfers from available reserves in accordance with existing law and New York State aid. The 2017 Capital Reserve Fund will not impact the tax levy.

Proposition 3 would allow the district to expend \$14.5 million, the remaining funds from the district's previously established 2013 Capital Reserve Fund, to undertake and perform school improvement projects. These projects totaling \$14.5 million include, but are not limited to, bathroom renovations, replacement of the turf fields at both high schools, replacement of the track at Division Avenue High School, renovation of MacArthur High School's auditorium, construction of an all-purpose room and cafeteria at Northside School and improvements and new construction related to traffic flow at various district sites. Proposition 3 will not impact the tax levy.

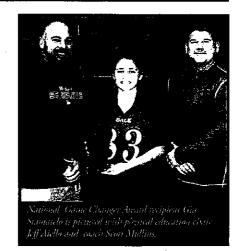
- Six student-athletes from Division Avenue and MacArthur High Schools have signed National Letters of Intent.

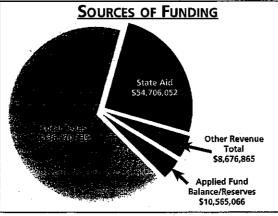

Questions & Answers

Q: What propositions will the community vote on at the polls?

A: This year, the community will vote on four propositions, as well as the individual Board member elections for the school district and library: Proposition 1 – Levittown UFSD 2017-18 Budget.
 Proposition 2 – Establishment of a 2017 Capital Reserve Fund totaling \$25 million (at no additional cost to the taxpayer).
 Proposition 3 – Expenditure of remaining monies from the 2013 Capital Reserve Fund (at no additional cost to the taxpayer).
 Proposition 4 – Levittown Public Library Budget.

Q: What are Proposition 2 and 3? Will they increase my taxes?

A: In addition to the district's proposed budget, the community will be asked to vote on Proposition 2 to allow for the establishment of a capital reserve fund totaling \$25 million for improvements to district facilities. Proposition 3 asks the community to vote on the expenditure of \$14.5 million from the capital reserve fund, previously established by voters in 2013, to undertake and perform school improvement projects. These projects include districtwide improvements to facilities, the replacement of both high school turf fields, bathroom renovations at both high schools, replacement of the Division Avenue High School track, renovation of the auditorium at MacArthur High School, an all-purpose room and cafeteria at Northside School and new construction related to traffic flow at all district sites. The establishment of the 2017 Capital Reserve Fund and the expenditure of funds from the 2013 Capital Reserve Fund will have no impact on the tax levy.

Q: Why does the increase in the tax levy cap vary from district to district and is not a consistent limit for all levels of government?

A: Each district must complete a tax levy worksheet based upon a formula provided by New York State to calculate its individual tax levy cap. Factors that impact the cap calculation include the tax base growth factor, received PILOT payments, debt service for capital projects and other exemptions, which vary among districts.

Q: What happens if the 2017-18 proposed budget is defeated at the polls?

A: If defeated, school districts have the option of putting the same or a revised budget up for a revote, or adopting a contingency budget. If a proposed budget is defeated twice, a contingency budget must be adopted. State law mandates that if a district is forced to adopt a contingency budget, the tax levy increase over the current year is capped at zero percent.

Democracy in Action

Students have been learning about American freedoms, including the freedom of speech and the right to vote.

On May 16, while community residents are voting on the 2017-18 proposed school budget, students will have the opportunity to vote on a new lunch item to be offered during the 2017-18 school year. The choices will be BBQ beef rib on a club roll, mini cheese ravioli, three-cheese mini pizza bagels or shredded pulled pork sandwiches.

Parents are encouraged to bring their children to the voting center after school until 8 p.m. to experience the voting process together. Student votes will be tallied and results will be announced at each building on May 17.

VOTER INFORMATION

Qualifications for Voting

A voter will be entitled to vote for the election of school district trustees and the school budget, who has the following qualifications: a citizen of the United States, 18 years or older, a resident of the district for a period of 30 days or more before the election, and anyone who voted in a school, state or national election during the four years prior to the pending election. Those not registered or who have not voted in four years must register to vote before Thursday, May 11, 2017.

Registration forms for school elections may be obtained from the district clerk's office at Levittown Memorial Education Center.

Absentee Ballots

You must be a registered voter in order to vote by absentee ballot. Absentee ballot applications are available in the office of the district clerk on any school day between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. Completed applications must be received by the district clerk by mail (Tuesday, May 9) or in person (Monday, May 15). Applicants can download an application from the school district website at www.levittownschools.com. Applications may not be submitted electronically because an original signature is required.

Upon receipt, your application will be reviewed, pursuant to the provisions of the education law, to establish your entitlement to vote by absentee ballot. A ballot will then be issued to you. For more information, contact the district clerk at 516-424-7002.

TOTAL COHORT RESULTS IN SECONDARY-LEVEL MATHEMATICS AFTER FOUR YEARS OF INSTRUCTION



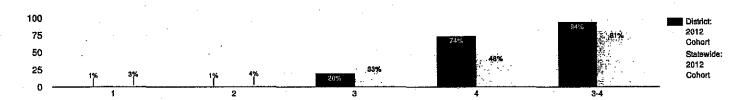

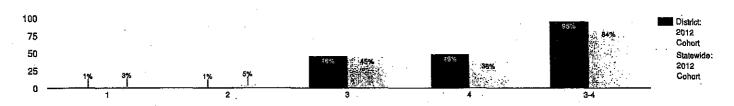

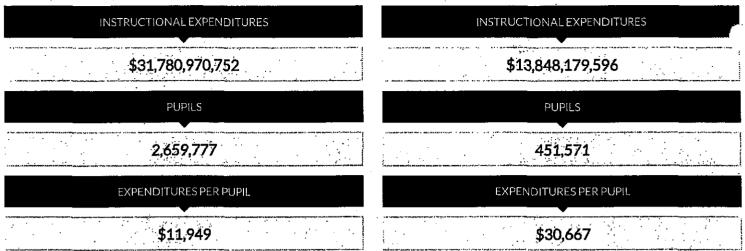

These expenditures include amounts for instruction of students with disabilities in a general-education setting. District expenditures, such as transportation, debt service and district-wide administration are not included.

The pupil count for General Education is K-12 average daily membership plus K-12 pupils for whom the district pays tuition to another school district. This number represents all pupils, including those classified as having disabilities and those not classified, excluding only students with disabilities placed out of district. Pupils resident in the district but attending a charter school are included. For districts in which a county jall is located, this number includes incarcerated youth to whom the district must provide an education program.

Instructional Expenditures for Special Education are K-12 expenditures for students with disabilities (including summer special education expenditures) plus a proration of building-level administrative and instructional support expenditures. District expenditures, such as transportation, debt service and district-wide administration are not included.

The pupil count for Special Education is a count of K-12 students with disabilities for the school year plus students for whom the district receives tuition from another district plus students for whom the district pays tuition to another district. Students attending the State schools at Rome and Batavia, private placements and out-of-state placements are included.

Instructional Expenditures Per Pupil is the simple arithmetic ratio of Instructional Expenditures to Pupils. The total cost of instruction for students with disabilities may include both general- and special-education expenditures. Special-education services provided in the general-education classroom may benefit students not classified as having disabilities.

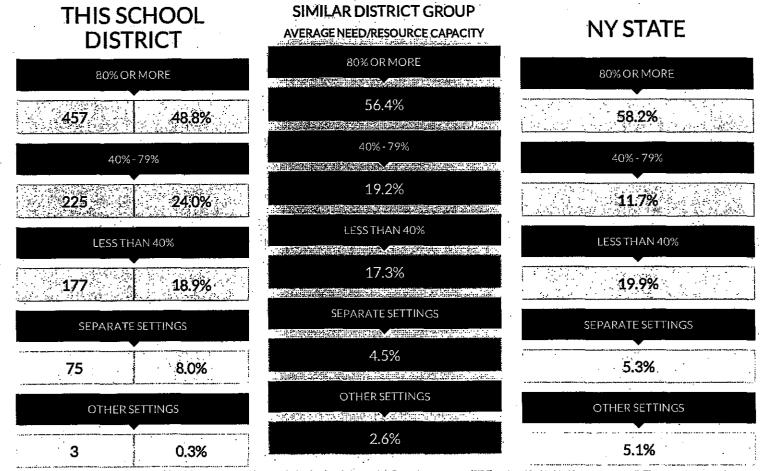

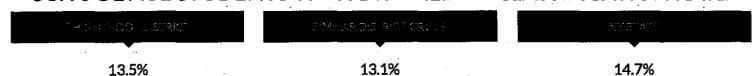

STUDENT PLACEMENT (PERCENT OF TIME INSIDE REGULAR CLASSROOM)



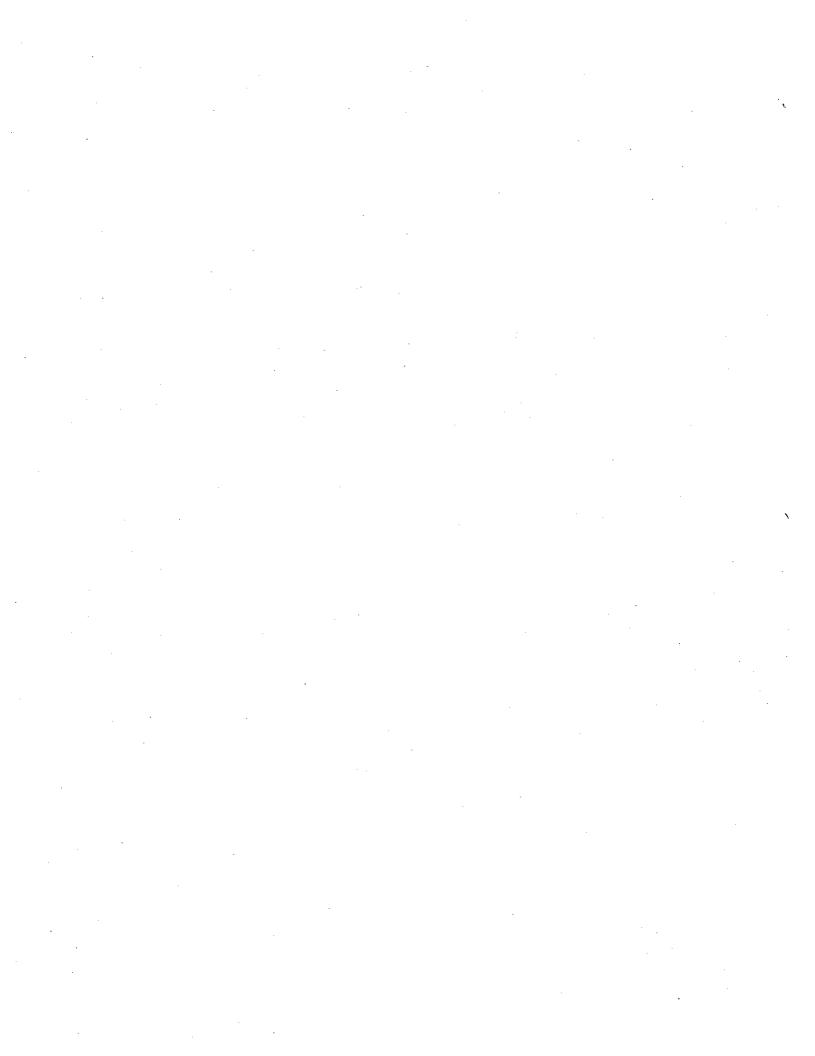
