



LEVITTOWN PRESENTS THE CLASS OF 2021

With high spirits and having overcome a year of adversity, Division Avenue High School and General Douglas MacArthur High School graduates took their seats at Hofstra University's James M. Shuart Stadium on June 19 to celebrate the close of their high school years and to look forward to the future.

Family and friends filled the complex sidelines as central and building administrators, Board members, keynote speakers and invited guests took their seats on stage as the ceremonies began.

Division Avenue Principal John Coscia told the students that the day represented "a redemption for time lost and a renewal of our freedoms." He also congratulated the Class of 2021 for their optimism during a time of adversity. "During a time that set people up for desperation and pessimism, you relentlessly and doggedly chose hope... the persistent pursuit of hope,

and a return to the life you love so deeply never wavered."

MacArthur High School Principal Joseph Sheehan described this year's graduation as a "day full of promise." He told the students that they should reach for challenges and that each of them controls their own destiny. Most importantly, he said to always ask the question, "What does my work say about me and my character?"

Superintendent of Schools Dr. Tonie McDonald encouraged the graduates to continue to "support the causes that fuel their passion." She also recognized the students from each school who will enter the military and thanked them for their commitment and service. Each of the students received a flag from one of their schools classrooms so they "can take a piece of the schools" with them.

During his valedictory address, Division Avenue

High School valedictorian Nikhil Keer called the Class of 2021 "extraordinary" and "amazing" and said, "no mask is strong enough to stop us from breathing fire." He told his classmates that "achievement is about so much more than a diploma. It's about hard work, efforts and goals, and new opportunities we have because of all we've done."

MacArthur High School valedictorian Emily Zhang described human beings as being in "constant flux." She said, "I believe that everyone has a unique role to play in life. However, these aren't fixed positions or concrete guidelines we must follow. So, as you move forward, don't shy away from the unknown."

The Class of 2021 also heard from their respective salutatorians and class presidents, who each reflected on their experiences and projected life lessons onto their fellow peers.

Board of Education President Peggy Marengi then congratulated the graduates on their resiliency as she officially presented the Class of 2021. Each of the graduates then walked across the stage to receive their diploma to the cheers of peers and family. Prior to the recessional off of the field, each of the schools' senior choir members accentuated the significance of the occasion by singing "The Irish Blessing" and "Never Grow Up."




