Presidents Report May 12, 2011

Just a few reminders: If you wish to speak, you must speak into one of the microphones or you will not be recognized. Please be respectful to comments expressed by your peers. There is a handout available on parliamentary procedures if you are interested.

The school year is almost done and we have little time to finish up the work of this year. As you have heard me say meeting after meeting...in my mind, our number one priority right now is to pass our district budget so we are ready to face July 1st and begin yet another school year. Most of us have had our unit elections and our incoming Officers also need to be ready to start work on July 1st.
