General Membership Meeting

April 18, 2013

Meeting called to order 7:35. Pledge of Allegiance. Attendance was taken, a quorum was established. Moment of silence for the people of Boston & Texas & the people that protect us.

Recording Secretary ~ Minutes were approved for February & March.

Treasurers' Report ~- Report attached. The accounts were audited tonight by Donna Waitkus & all was found to be in order.

Superintendent Report ~ Testing is being done this week, the tests are far more rigorous than in the past. Within the testing, we found that the same reading passage was in the 3 different grade levels. The readability was challenging. The state's rational in doing that was they are trying to vertically align. There were multiple questions that were very similar in multiple grade levels. The tests were very different than what we had seen before. Some kids did meet with frustration, they made their best efforts & not everyone finished. SED has asked for comments back. Math is next week. We are one in only five schools that was asked to be tested using the common core standards.

Budget planning session & hearing was last night. Dr. Grossane feels they are very close to agreeing upon a tax levy. This year the teachers' retirement system increased by 4 million dollars. The budget was presented to the board with a 2.94 increase but it could go up to 3.54 or less. Next BOE meeting, they will be voting & adopting on a budget.

A presentation was given by our outside auditors, basically saying, while we are currently in better financial shape than some other districts, we are reaching a crossroads next year. Next year's budget will be the first year that we will not be able to replace the money taken out of reserve. So we would be operating at an operational deficit. He felt that it might be around 4 million dollars, which is manageable, but to proceed with caution so it doesn't increase any further than that. We are being frugal this year because the larger the surplus is at the end of this year, the less the deficit will be. It is just a realistic picture that will be coming down the road for our district. Please attend the BOE meeting next Wednesday.

Q. Does the district do a 5 year plan?

A. Yes, it does. Currently in negotiating with our unions.

Q. Was there a tally kept on what schools had how many children opt-out of the testing?

A. Yes, there was a tally kept, it won't impact any school as far as AYP, with the exception of Salk. Salk had a large number of students in the 8th grade. We're still not sure what the state will do, we're hopeful that they won't penalize our Title 1 money. We have to wait and see what the state does.

Q. Don't these tests effect the placement of honor students?

A. Placement in honors classes is not solely based on the state assessments. It is part of a matrix that is used to determine if a child should be in honors or not. It is supposed to be guidance on how the child is doing.

Q. If a child does poorly on these tests, they will then require services (ie: AIS), which costs money. How is the district going to pay for this?

A. Yes, the district would be mandated to give that child services. It would have to come from somewhere since the services are an unfunded mandate.

Mr.Lipani will be giving his presentation which is open to all parents rather than going to each unit. It will be held on May 6, 2013.

Reminder - the budget newsletter will be sent out. This year, however, the Public library has exercised their right to have the library vote on the same day as the school budget vote. The other thing on the ballot this year is asking

the voters for approval of a capital reserve fund. It enables us to take capital projects out of the budget & putting in reserves.

Elementary Curriculum Met on Monday April 1st. Keith Snyder came to the meeting to speak about the physical education curriculum in the district. He discussed the NYS Dept. of Education PE standards and stated that each PE teacher has the ability to use their creativity and strengths in order to cover each of the standards and ensure the skills are met. The complete document can be found at <u>http://www.p12.nysed.gov/ciai/pe/pels.html</u>

The district will be updating and revising the Elementary PE curriculum over the summer. Curriculum should show what ages certain benchmarks should be met.

Standard 1 - Personal Health and Fitness

Students will have the necessary knowledge and skills to establish and maintain physical fitness, participate in physical activity, and maintain personal health. – Students will perform basic motor and manipulative skills they will attain competency in a variety of physical activities and proficiency in few select complex motor and sports activities.

Standard 2 - A Safe and Healthy Environment

Students will acquire the knowledge and ability necessary to create and maintain a safe and healthy environment. – Students will demonstrate responsible personal and social behavior while engaged in physical activity. They will understand that physical activity provides the opportunity for enjoyment, challenge, self-expression, and communication. Students will be able to identify safety hazards and react effectively to ensure a safe and positive experience for all participants.

Standard 3 - Resource Management

Students will understand and be able to manage their personal and community resources. – Students will be aware of and be able to access opportunities available to them within their community to engage in physical activity. They will be informed consumers and be able to evaluate facilities and programs. Students will be aware of some career options in the field of physical fitness and sports.

We then went over the State Assessments-

We were given a hand out from engageny-a message from Dr. King, the Commissioner of the NYS Dept of Ed. It outlined 5 key points of what the common core assessments really mean.

1-Standards are different, test will be different and more difficult, therefore the number of students who score at or above grade level expectations will likely decrease.

2-Expect the decline to have little or no impact on principals' and teachers' state provided growth scores. Measuring students against standards, not students against other students.

3-The decline in scores should not be interpreted as a decline in student performance, rather it will give educators, parents, policymakers and the public a more realistic picture of where studetns are on their path to being well-prepared for the world that awaits them after they graduate HS.

4-No new districts will be identifies as Focus Districts and no new schools will be identified as Priority Schools based on the 12-13 results.

We then concluded the meeting with the testing times and days for each test.

Secondary Curriculum met on April 5, 2013

Michele Ortiz came and spoke about the foreign language department and options for students.

Foreign Language begins in 7th grade where 7th and 8th grade count as 1 HS credit. They then take the Checkpoint A assessment. When they continue onto 9th and 10th grade, they then take the Checkpoint B assessment-which is at the end of level 3. Students take checkpoint assessments, because there are no more Regents for foreign language.

Foreign language for college credit is a full year course, although they can pay for only $\frac{1}{2}$ semester of college credit and continue in the class.

Spanish 4 accelerated is now Spanish Pre-AP

eq Gave a handout regarding the benefits of studying a foreign language:

Benefits to society-Americans fluent in other languages improve global communication, enhance our economic competitiveness abroad and maintain our political and security interests (center for applied linguistics 2004)

According to the 2000 census, only 9% of Americans can speak a second language, whereas over 50% of Europeans speak one or more languages.

Strong evidence shows that time spent on foreign language study strongly reinforces the core subject areas of reading, English language literacy, social studies and math. Foreign language learners consistently out perform control groups in core subject areas on standardized tests, often significantly.

Project lead the way

Big push on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math)

Hoping to put the program in place as part of technology in the middle school as a pilot program. If goes well, then move to HS the following year.

Regent Changes for next year

All students in 11th grade will have to take an English Common Core Regent.

Also have to take the regular NYS Regent exam during Regent week and highest score can count as the students grade. This will also be the same for Math. Geometry will be the same as is this year, no changes until 14/15.

Spoke about the testing times and days for each State Assessment

We got notice from NYS that our 2 high schools will be field testing Common Core Regent Exams, no announcement of what subjects or where. ELA

Day 1: Reading 90 minutes, plus 10 minute prep -42 m/c question & answer

Day 2: Reading 90 minutes, plus 10 minute prep -21 m/c question & answer Reading/Writing – 3 short response and 1 extended response.

MATH

Grade 6, 7 & 8

Day 1: 90 minutes, plus 10 minute prep – 34 m/c question & answer Day 2: 90 minutes, plus 10 minute prep – 34 m/c question & answer Day 3: 90 minutes, plus 10 minute prep -5 short response and 1 extended response.





Levittown Public Library Online Tutoring Program

The Levittown Public Library online tutoring program is available through both the children's and teen pages of our website:

It is also available directly at www.tutor.com/nassau

It does require a library card to log in and create an account. Requiring a library card is a new development, because of increased usage. You could personalized your account with an email address but that is not required.

One on one tutoring is available 7 days a week from 2 - 10 pm for all grades, college age and adult learners. There are also study guides available 24/7 for many subjects when tutors are not available. The first time the program is used a Microsoft product Silverlight must be downloaded but they walk you through it. The student will choose which area they need help in -Math, Science, English and Social Studies. They have tutors for AP subjects as well. From the statistics we see, Math gets the most use. The student will be assigned a tutor (during busy times they may be on a virtual line waiting for a tutor). The tutor session proceeds like an online chat. They have software similar to a whiteboard, which enables them to draw or diagram, particularly useful for math. These tutors are vetted by the company and many are former or current teachers. Importantly, the tutors are very good at helping the student see what their difficulty is without doing their assignment for them. One student told us that the tutor helped him figure out a good science fair project based on what he was interested in.


Dear Levittown and Island Trees Neighbors,
