Elementary Met on May 9

Most discussion was about Summer Reading Program for current 4th graders. The book is The Kid Who Ran for President. A website has been designed by Northside and Abbey teachers. The website will include read alouds by teachers and a blog. Ms. Maya has been visiting the elementary schools to discuss with PTAs.

June 14 and June 15 is the kickoff which will include wearing Red, white and blue and a special event in each elementary school.

The summer library program for the book will be held on 7/21 for Northside and Summit, 8/2 for Abbey & Lee Rd and 8/23 for East Broadway and Gardiners. Registration through Levittown Public Library is required.

Secondary met on 5/16

- AP Capstone will run 2 sections in each high school
- Grading Policy is being reconsidered throughout district to ensure more consistency among teachers within the same subject area. Directors are developing a scale that would require the same formula, as in percentages are the same across courses.
- ACT bootcamp is being help in May
- Question came up of Parent-Teacher Conferences on the secondary level. They are not done and are not in the teacher's contracts. One-on-one is always available
- Question about phone policy being clarified in middle schools. Students and parents are told "no phones" during school hours yet some teachers use apps during class instruction.
- "Out of school" is a phone app which should be considered dangerous by parents. Anonymous comments are made and cannot be removed.
- Summer reading launch is June1 at Wisdom and June 2 at Salk
- 8th Grade will receive The Book Thief in June for summer reading with 3 weeks of curriculum tied to the book in the fall.
- Current 10th grade will read A Tree Grows in Brooklyn, 11th Long Way Gone and 12th Outliers; AP Students get additional assignments

READ is a showcase of student work which is planned for Oct 27th at 7pm
