The Community

MacArthur High School students hail from Levittown, Seaford and Wantagh, and form a middle income suburban community located in central Nassau County, Long Island, approximately 30 miles from Manhattan. The district is made up of six elementary schools, two middle schools and two high schools.

The High School

MacArthur High School is a comprehensive high school of 1248 students in grades 9-12. The class of 2027 totals 294 students. The school is accredited by the Middle States Association and by the New York State Board of Regents. Advanced Placement courses are available in English, Social Studies, Math, Science, World Language, Art and Business, as well as the AP Capstone program.

College credit-bearing courses are available in Art, Business, English, Family and Consumer Science, Math, Science, Social Studies, Technology and World Language through a partnership with SUNY Farmingdale State, Molloy University, Long Island University, SUNY Oswego and Suffolk CC.

In addition, a Science research program is available. Full vocational programs are available for work-bound and technical college students.

Per New York State, any student who passed a class during the 2021-22 or 2022-23 school years and earned a Regents score of 50-64 shall be granted a Special Appeal "SA" on their transcript, and were eligible to earn credit for exam.

Graduation Requirements

The Levittown Public School District requires that students earn 22 credits for a Regents or Advanced Regents diploma, in alignment with the New York State graduation requirements.

Grade reports are issued quarterly. The transcript indicates final grades, and/or Regents examination grades where applicable. Course level designations are indicated on the transcript by "R" for regents level, "Acl" or "H" for accelerated level and by "AP" for advanced placement level. The lowest passing grade is a 65. Grade equivalency is:

A- to A+ (4.0) = 90-100	B- to B+ (3.0) = 80-89
C- to C+ (2.0) = 70-79	D (1.0) = 65-69
F = Below 65	

Weighted Average

Courses repeated for the purpose of obtaining a higher grade use only the higher grade in the average. The weighted average is computed after six semesters using all numerical grades excluding Physical Education. We do not rank students. The weighted average is determined by applying a 1.075 weight factor to all AP courses. Accelerated/Honors courses receive a 1.050 weight factor and College level courses receive a 1.065 weight factor. The announcement of the valedictorian and salutatorian is made after the first semester of the senior year.

ENGLISH

- **Advanced Placement-** College level courses for students in grades 10, 11 and 12.
- **Honors Program-** Intensive and challenging courses for students in grades 9 and 10.
- **English 9, 10, 11, 12-** Regents level courses in English.

SOCIAL STUDIES

- **Advanced Placement-** College level courses offered in United States History, World History, Government, Human Geography, Economics and Psychology.
- **Honors Program-** Challenging courses in Global Studies I, Government, and Economics.
- **Social Studies 9, 10, 11, 12-** Regents level courses in Social Studies.

MATHEMATICS

- **Advanced Placement-** College level courses offered in Statistics, AB and BC Calculus.
- **Accelerated Program-** Challenging and enriched courses in Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II and Pre-Calculus.
- **Calculus-** College credit bearing course through a partnership with SUNY.
- **Precalculus-** College credit bearing courses in Precalculus R and Acl through a partnership with SUNY.
- **Probability or Statistics -** College credit bearing courses through a partnership with SUNY.
- **Regents courses-** Regents courses in Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II.

SCIENCE

- **Advanced Placement-** College level courses in Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science and Physics I & II.
- **Biology, Anatomy & Physiology, Astronomy, Health Professions, Marine Biology, Forensics and Physics—** College credit bearing course through a partnership with Molloy University.
- **Research Program-** This course is open to students in grades 9-12 who meet selection criteria. The course provides students with the opportunity for in-depth study and individual instruction in the principles and methods of scientific research.
- **Accelerated Program-** Challenging and enriched courses in Earth Science, Living Environment and Chemistry.
- **Regents Program-** Regents level courses in Earth Science, Living Environment & Chemistry.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

- **Advanced Placement-** College level courses in French, Italian and Spanish.
- **College level courses-** College credit bearing courses in French 4 & 5, Italian 4 & 5, and Spanish 4 & 5 through a partnership with Molloy University.
- **Honors courses—** level 3 French, Italian & Spanish
- **Regents courses-** Regents level courses in Spanish, French

UNIVERSITY LEVEL COURSES

Advanced Placement (AP)

We offer Advanced Placement in 24 different courses. There is a total enrollment of over 400 students in these courses which follow the College Board curriculum. Many students are enrolled in more than one course, and students traditionally begin taking AP courses in tenth grade.
